



Ramadan is also about sharing and giving, and so to start off this month I would love to share this with you.

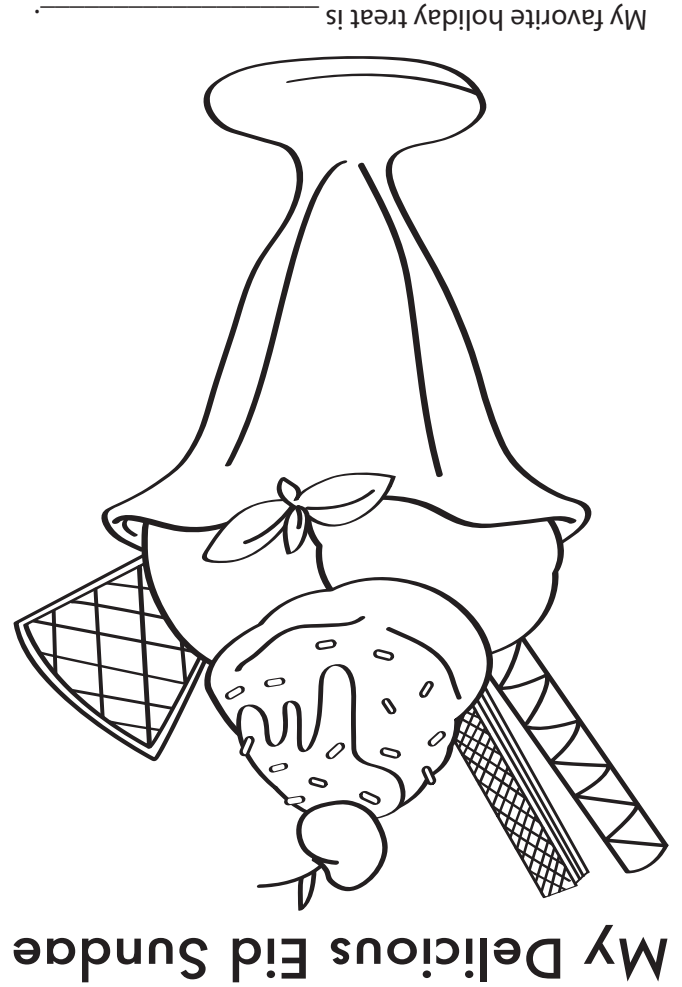
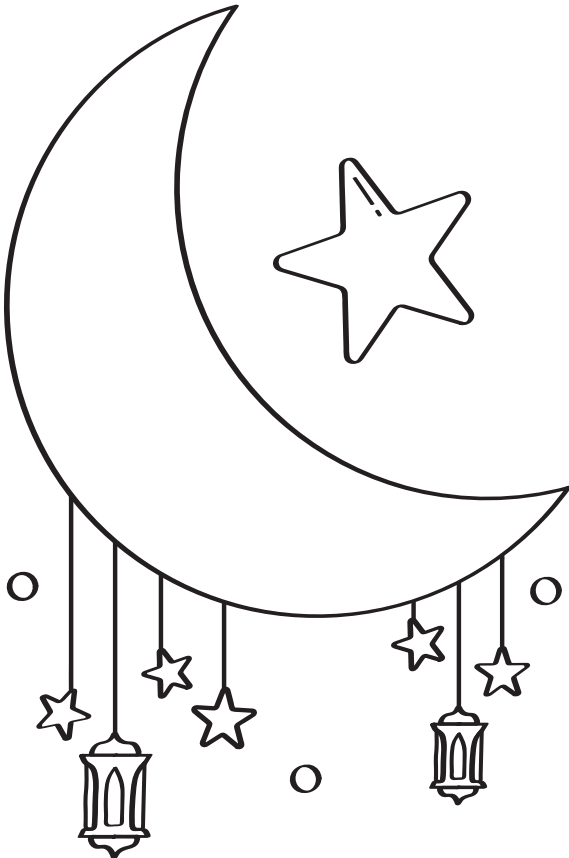

Happy Ramadan!

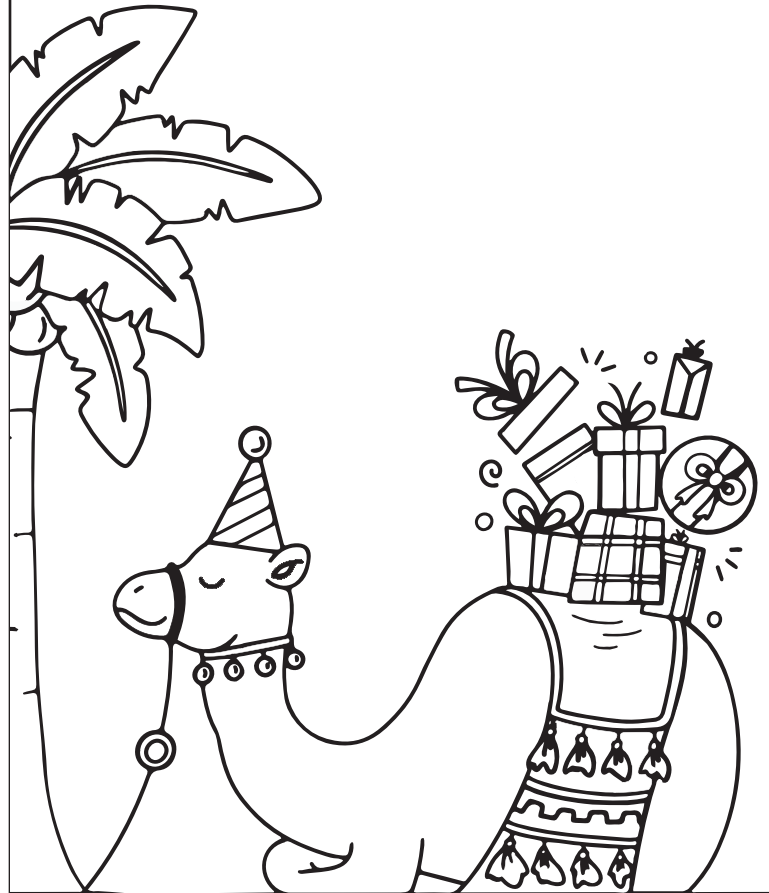


The Islamic calendar is a lunar calendar following the monthly cycles of the moon's phases. The sighting of the crescent moon marks the start of the holy month of Ramadan.
